Nick,

Here is my recommendation for the request for signage on S. 18th St. north of Franklin St. for the WAF fork lift crossing.

I have attached some photos I took today as well as typical MUTCD warning signs.

I think that we should install a yellow and black warning sign that either shows a picture of a Fork Lift if our traffic control/sign person can create it (similar to the golf cart W11-11) or make a Sign that would say Fork Lift Crossing similar to the Truck Crossing sign shown (W8-6). I would think we would use 30" by 30" signs.

One sign could be mounted to MPU Pole number 1H-3589 and the other on a new sign post in front of 818 South 18th St. which is about 250 feet north of the fork lift crossing.

I know that the sign on the wood utility pole is not very far from the actual crossing, but I do not know how you would put up signs on Franklin St. to show the fork lift crossing on the side street.

I believe it was the westbound right hand turn off of Franklin St. that is the issue or any turns off of Franklin St.

If the Committee does not like the 1st recommendation, I suppose you could install normal pedestrian crossing signs right at the concrete crossing. We could also look a painting a white line on both sides of the crossing similar to a crosswalk, but I am not sure how much that will help as the pavement is lower than the tracks so it may be hard to see. In this case, I think that signage will be more visible than any pavement markings.

After re-reading the original e-mail again, I see that they also have employees crossing there as well. I thought it was just fork lifts with an operator, hence my first recommendation.

If the Committee is more comfortable with Pedestrian Crossing Signs I am fine with that too I guess. However, if the pedestrian crossing signs go up then it probably would make sense to also put down pavement markings.

The cost of the work should probably be the responsibility of WAF as they were the ones who wanted and needed this crossing.

The 2 signs would have a cost of \$400 plus or minus. Pavement Markings could be done by City Staff as well at a cost of \$100 to \$200. I would think that total cost would be in the range of \$400 to \$700.


