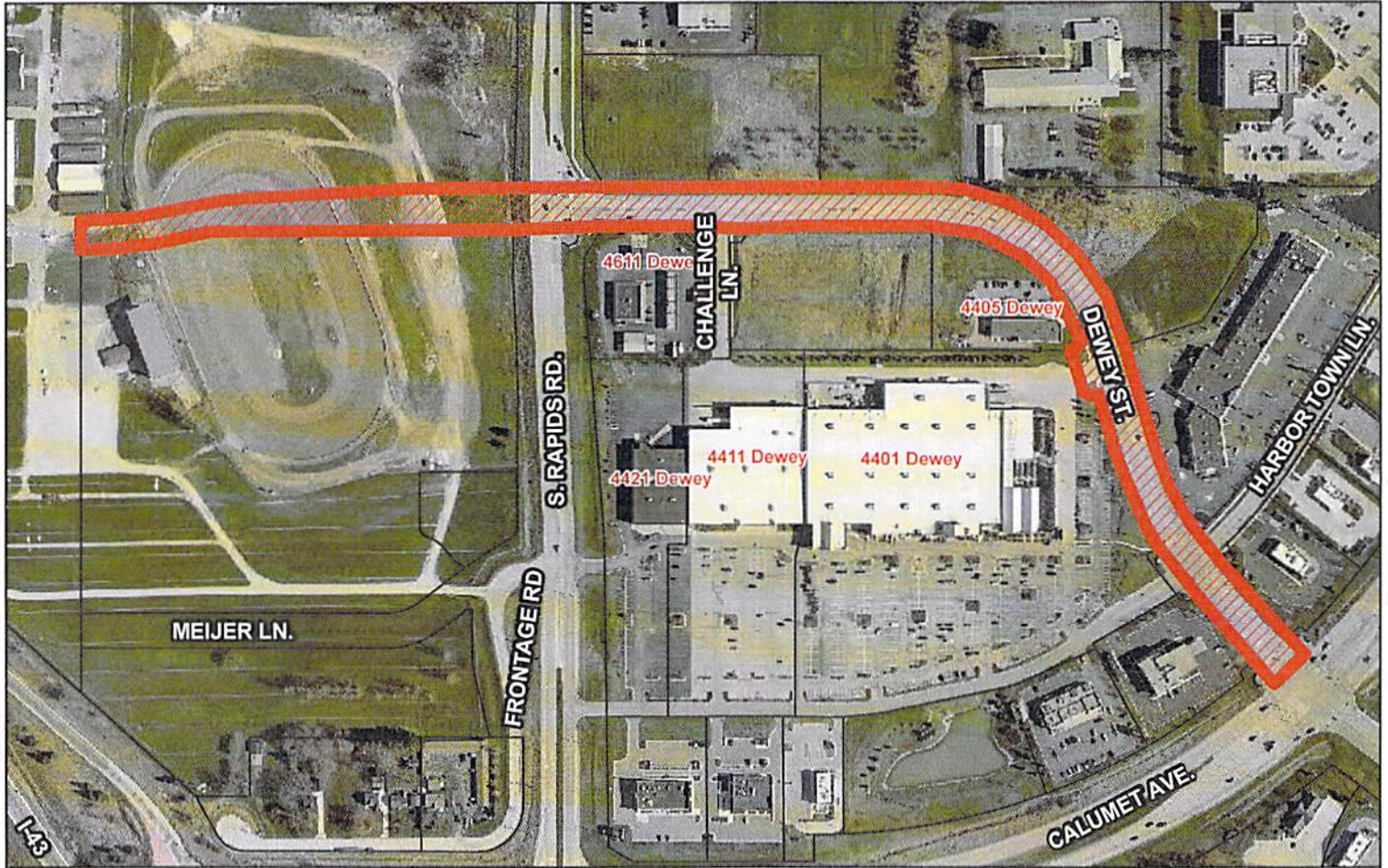

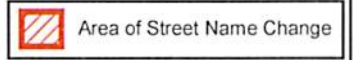

Former Mayors with streets named after them:

Dufek Drive (25. Tony Dufek 1973-1989)

Menchl Drive (22. Rudolph Menchl 1951-1955)

Schroeder Drive (15. John Schroeder 1917-1921 and 1927-1929)

Kemper Street (12. William Kemper 1903-1905)

Torrison Drive (7. Thomas Torrison 1887-1889 and 1895-1899)

Johnston Drive (1. Peter Johnston 1870-1872)

Notable:

Joseph Villas (10. 1893-1895)

Builder and owner of what became the Rahr Mansion, now the Rahr-West Art Museum

Henry Stolze Jr. (13. 1905-1907 and 1911-1917)

Began MPU with a stone outside the building indicating "Mayor of Accomplishments"

Kevin Crawford was the city's longest consecutive serving Mayor from April 1989 to April 2009. He won 6 elections in 1989, 1991, 1993, 1997, 2001, and 2005.
