Hi Patti,

Please add this issue to the January 2017 Public Safety Committee agenda.

She walks her 3 dogs regularly and there is no good place to cross Broadway St. from the west side (North and South legs of Harvest Cir.). She stated that crossing from west to east at the south leg of Harvest Circle is not too bad but crossing the opposite direction from east to west is more of a challenge.

She stated that she almost got hit last week and that is when she called. She stated that there have been other close calls out there.

I told her that I could recommend/support a crosswalk on the south side of the "T" intersection at the north leg of Harvest Circle as there is much better site distance at this location compared to the south leg of Harvest, which is on a curve. However, this would mean that abutting property owner (Brunnel I believe) would have to shovel the crosswalk. Perhaps, they should be invited to the meeting as well so that they are aware of the situation.

She always walks to the north in winter as going down the Broadway St. hill in winter is too dangerous.
