Re: Request to approve Community Garden S 14th street site

I would like to recommend that the City Council approve the request for Grow it Forward to construct and maintain a community Garden on City owned property and parkland at S 14th and Flambeau Streets.

Grow it Forward will work with the City Parks Department throughout all phases of this project. The Parks Department will monitor the project to ensure that all requirements are being met.

The group has shown much enthusiasm and has many supporters for this location. The Park and Recreation Committee discussed this at its October 20th meeting and did not have any objections.

Grow It Forward—Letter of Intent

14th Street Parkland

To whom this may concern:

Over the past seven months a group of residents have come together with desire to develop and support a local, sustainable food system and share our vision with the residents of Manitowoc. This vision includes the development of an educational neighborhood garden. We have developed a strong and diversified coalition of supporters including: Lakeshore CAP, Healthiest Manitowoc, Manitowoc Health Department, Clipper City Coop, UW Manitowoc, Lakeshore Technical College, Silver Lake College, Lincoln High School, Holy Family Wellness Center, and Two Rivers Community Garden. We also have ongoing support of experienced Community Supported Agriculture groups (CSAs) and Master Gardeners, who have attended most of our meetings.

As you may recall, our initial proposal site request of Union Park was denied—not only by local resident, but also through Council. With assistance from Chad Scheinoha, Dan Koski, Jill Hennessey, and Mike Howe, we looked at other potential locations. With this letter, it is Grow It Forward's intent to secure 14th Street Parkland as the site for an educational neighborhood garden. Additionally, the majority of residents near this location signed a letter of support for our project.

In general, the garden would be a place where community members, some of whom do not have their own gardening space (those living in apartment buildings), or who have too much shade, could grow nutritious, locally sourced produce. Our garden will feature many innovative and unconventional growing techniques including: raised beds, straw bale, permaculture beds. 50% of our produce will be donated to local charitable groups and utilized for educational programing, and the remaining 50% will be reserved for our Work Share program. Beyond healthy food options, the garden will serve as a gathering place facilitating positive social interactions, and could be the epicenter for ecotourism in our city. The neighborhood garden will include the offering of educational workshops, youth gardening programs, and wellness events.

Some technical matters have been discussed with the City Attorney, Kathleen McDaniel, which includes liability insurance, garden rules and regulations, and hold-harmless forms. All costs for the neighborhood garden project would be covered by Grow It Forward and the gardeners.

Grow It Forward is committed to the creation and continued upkeep of an educational neighborhood garden within the city of Manitowoc.

The Public Information Session will be held October 2nd, 2014 at Manitowoc City Hall and will begin at 6:00PM.




