The message below brings up a potential need for some additional lighting in the City parking lot at 10th and York. I have advised Brian to contact the PD to report the incidents, but he had also asked whether some additional lighting could help the situation. How does that process work? Is there a staff evaluation that can be done? Does it go to the PI Committee for consideration? I'm hoping to get back to Brian with some direction on how to proceed.

I'm copying Kathleen just for awareness with at least one of these incidents spilling over onto City/CDA property. It sounds like most of the harassment is verbal and happening on/near the sidewalk outside Revolutions. For the Dermatology employee that was followed, she apparently ended up running to her car to get in and lock the doors as quickly as possible.

Nic,
I wanted to discuss this with you before contacting the Mayor. We have 4 reported incidents in the past 3 weeks involving our staff members walking from our buildings to their cars in the York & 10th Street lot. They all involve men outside of the Revolutions Bar. It appears the smokers stand outside on the sidewalk on York. As you know, most of our employees are women. The incidents are happening between 5pm and 8pm. Several cases of men making inappropriate comments to women walking to their cars. In one case, the men followed a young lady to her car.

First of all, I would like to involve the police. Perhaps they can talk to Revolutions about their smoking area and the problems it is causing and they can oversee their customers. It seems like they should have a designated smoking area vs a public sidewalk. Second, we would like to see additional police patrols in the area during the times when these incidents have occurred. The parking lot is dark, and we are asking that the city install additional lighting in the lot for public safety.

Please get back to me as soon as possible. This is a hot issue for us right now and we don't want to see anyone get hurt.
