In addition to drafting legislation and reviewing contracts as requested by City departments, the City Attorney's Office has worked on the following projects and initiatives since my December 3, 2021update:

Environmental Remediation

- Lemberger Landfill: Work continues as planned.
- Gravel Pit: Newell cost recovery continues. PSC has approved watermain construction.
- WPS Superfund Site: No update.

Open Records Requests

- MGW Law re Renegades Bar (police reports)
- Chicago Title Company re tax roll

Litigation, Prosecution, and Neighborhood Improvement

- MAVCB and Hearty Olive are suing the City over the termination and non-renewal of the services agreement
- Assist Police with ordinance interpretation questions
- Blighted properties: Asst. City Attorney continues to work with Housing Inspector and Crime Prevention Sergeant to address, see updates from Chief Blaser to Public Safety for razing information

Economic Development

- Assist CD Department with upcoming projects
 - o Metal Ware waiting on developer
 - o Old Heresite property -ongoing
 - o Proposed housing developments
 - o Other confidential developments

LEAN/BPI

- Assisted staff with advice on BPI events as needed
- Asst. City Attorney serving as chair of BPI committee
- Acquisitions event followup needed to be rescheduled due to staff absences

Insurance/Risk Management

- Reviewed claims filed against the City, reported to insurance and Finance as appropriate
- ADA Title II work in progress, bimonthly meetings scheduled
- Insurance company will be requiring two factor authentication in order to get robust cybersecurity coverage

Labor Matters

- Fire: Contract ratified and signed
- Assist unionized departments with personnel matters as needed
- Assist HR with policy interpretation, legal questions, and discipline as necessary

Office Matters/Additional Information

CityLaw software was upgraded

Monthly Reporting on Workload

- 14 Requests for Legal Services received, 29 closed
- 4 new litigation matters (3 animal bites, 1 claim, lawsuit from MAVCB)
- 26 new citations sent over for prosecution, trials scheduled into spring 2022
