Dear Mayor Nickels and Mr. Scheinoha:

As both of you are aware, the ball diamond improvements in this city are being planned by Manitowoc Youth Baseball Association (MYBA) and the fundraising is making progress. The purpose of this letter is to request funds from the Parkland Dedication Fund.

The MYBA was formed in 1989 by a group of youth baseball coaches to help promote youth participation in baseball. There were many children in the county who wanted to play league baseball but were never before afforded the opportunity.

MYBA manages an average of about 50 youth baseball/softball teams spread out over 7 different leagues. On the boys baseball side we have our Galaxy League (grades 1-2), the World League (grades 3-4), the Astro League (grades 5-6), and the Cosmo League (grades 7-10). On the girls softball side we have the Ponytails Division (grades 1-3), the Junior League (grades 4-6) and the Senior League (grades 7-9). Throughout the season we play about 240 games with an average of 34-36 games per week.

The Manitowoc Youth Baseball Association has started a campaign to raise money for a new 4-plex youth baseball complex at Citizen Park in Manitowoc. With \$991,000 raised/pledged to date on this \$1.79 million project, we are seeking donors and sponsors to get us to completion.

The fundraising for these improvements has been challenging, but we have had some significant contributions from various organizations and companies. One of the most notable contributions is coming from the Baseball Tomorrow Fund grant. This award is for the amount of \$150,000. Another significant donor is a challenge grant from the West foundation, in the amount of \$300,000. Both of these gifts have some contingencies involved with them. Both want our organization to be able to show records of having a specific dollar amount in the bank by a specific date. If we do not accomplish this, we may lose out on these very generous gifts, and consequently our upgrades to the city may be delayed even further.

It is with this consideration that our organization would like to ask for an amount of \$50,000 from the Parkland Dedication Fund. It would seem that this is an appropriate request based on the financial commitment our

committee is responsible for raising. These improvements will "show off" our city quite a bit, and most importantly hundreds and hundreds of kids for many years to come will reap the benefits from this amazing facility.

MYBA has a vision to allow every child in Manitowoc County the chance to play baseball on beautiful, safe and convenient fields, regardless of their socioeconomic status or skill level. We strive to include youth across the county from varying backgrounds and abilities. With these new fields, we are hoping to increase our female participation by 20% and our minority participants by 10%. We will accomplish this by providing an attractive and conveniently located complex with creative outreach efforts, passionate coaches and dedicated volunteers. We also hope to increase participation of disadvantaged youth by collaborating with community youth programs and promoting the fact that we will waive fees for disadvantaged families.

When we complete this new 4-plex baseball complex it will become a true community hub for all youth and their families in the area to come to and play ball. The Manitowoc Visitor's Convention Bureau conducted an economic impact study for us to determine just what kind of impact we can make. It turns out that each tournament held at the new 4-plex with teams from outside our area would bring a conservatively estimated \$37,177 into our community. We should be able to hold anywhere from 2-4 tournaments per year, bringing an estimated \$74,354 - \$148,708 into Manitowoc every year.



To Whom It May Concern:

"It takes an entire village to raise a child." I am sure you have seen, or heard, this phrase before. In this case, however, "it takes an entire city community to raise a child." The Manitowoc Public School District and the city of Manitowoc Park and Recreation Department, have joined forces in a "shared agreement" to build a multiple-use, multiple-facility, baseball/softball complex in the city.

Raising a child comes in different phases and areas of interest. One of the best areas of interest that I know of is in the athletic area. Participation in recreational athletics provides young people the ability to continue exercising their minds and bodies, while also competing with others of the same age group, within the community. The Manitowoc Public School District, along with the city of Manitowoc Park and Recreation Department invite our community youth to engage in a wide range of athletic activities focused on both team and individual performance. One of the main ways we do that in the spring, summer, and fall, is to encourage children to be a part of a baseball or softball program that is being offered in both, the district and recreation department.

Our current situation is not one that truly encourages all age groups to participate, however. We have an extremely limited amount of baseball-only fields in the community or on school grounds. In the community, Manitowoc has only 2 baseball fields and just three softball-only fields. With a community population of 33, 736, and a County population of over 81,000 residents, the number of viable ball diamonds for our youth is low. As low as that number is in the community (5 fields), there is an even less number within the school district (2), and those fields are not playable for a state-sanctioned high school team for baseball or softball.

The grant that we are applying for will greatly enhance the opportunities for our youth. The shared agreement that the district has with the park and recreation department will continue to grow in depth and accountability when this new facility is built. Funds generated from offering leagues, tournaments, and baseball/softball clinics, will go right back into the continued development of both programs and relationships with both community entities.

I hope that you can understand the magnitude of our dilemma and our need. If you have further questions of me, please do not hesitate to contact me.
