What I am writing to you about is in reference to a 'Snow Shoveling Violation' that we received in February 2020 that resulted in a charge of \$300. I wanted to write to dispute this charge for the following reasons.

- 1. During the date of the violation, I was traveling for work and out of the State. My wife was taking care of our two kids (one of them who had recently fractured his foot) when she saw someone out shoveling our sidewalk. When she went out and asked them what they were doing, they said that 'the city sent us out here to clean up your sidewalk'. She mentioned that she had started a few days ago and had finished the first part of our sidewalk (which can be seen from the image) but was called by Riverview Elementary (where my oldest son was in 5th grade) to say that he was in a lot of pain and needed to come home. Because of that, she stopped shoveling and went and picked him up. Due to extremely cold temperatures the next day (or two) she didn't get a chance to finish. She then went on to say that she would be able to finish now but they told her "we already started, so we have to finish".
- 2. My wife said that no one knocked on our door prior to starting to issue a warning or advise them what they were doing.

I do feel that in a community like ours, a warning of some kind should have been given - either by posting a notice, by mail, by phone or by a simple knock on the door. This past summer, a field on a neighboring street had a notice posted on it for failure to mow the high weeds. The notice was posted by the City of Manitowoc - Streets Division and mentioned that if the weeds in question are "...not cut within 48 hours of the date of this notice, the city's contractor will cut the property and the city will assess the costs to the property owner". In this case, notice was posted and the owner of the parcel/lot was advised as to what would happen. In our case, no notice was given at all.

I also want to mention that, if you refer to the image that was included with the violation (attached) you will note that the section of sidewalk in question (totalling 40.5 feet in length) has very little snow actually on the ground with many areas having the concrete sidewalk showing through. I believe the cost of \$300 is extremely excessive - especially when it is noted that the labor time was 35 minutes. Also, the fact that it was noted that 1 bag of salt was used is also something I would dispute as the section is not long and certainly did not have the contents of an entire bag of salt thrown on it after I inspected it.

I would greatly appreciate your assistance in getting this violation fee of \$300 dismissed. Considering the fact that my wife did start shoveling and then couldn't finish for reasons mentioned above, the fact that the men shoveling would not let my wife shovel and told her "they had to finish", as well as the lack of any warnings or notice from the city, seem to be reason enough - but I would also like to state that this is our first violation and we have been home owners in Manitowoc for over 10 years. We love our city and our community I would hope that the Board of Public Works would take the above comments and circumstances into consideration and void the charge.




