> I've attached pictures of the Collins Road bridge span.
>
> This bridge was originally one of five spans that carried Collins Road
> over the Manitowoc River in the Town of Rockland. Built in 1911, it
> was replaced in 2001 and moved to Pinecrest Historical Village. This
> span is preserved to illustrate the typical riveted-metal truss
> construction of Warren Pony Truss bridges. These bridges were
> prevalent in Wisconsin from the early 20th century through the 1930s.
>
> We would certainly be able to donate the bridge if you think it would
work.
> Otherwise it will likely become scrap or a reuse for another organization.
