

Section 2. Holidays. Holidays are identified to establish a consistent procedure for scheduling business closure except in situations where staffing is required for emergency and maintenance operations. The following holidays will be observed: New Year's Day, ½ Day on Friday preceding Easter, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Day after Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve Day, Christmas Day. When a holiday falls on a Saturday, the holiday will be observed on the Friday immediately preceding. When a holiday falls on a Sunday, the holiday will be observed on the following Monday. When Christmas Day falls on a Saturday, the preceding Thursday will be observed for Christmas Eve and the preceding Friday will be observed for Christmas Day. Any non-exempt employee who is scheduled to work on any of the above holidays will be compensated at the rate of ~~straight time~~ time and one half for work performed on the ~~observed-actual~~ observed-actual holiday, ~~the day preceding Easter and the day after Thanksgiving are not considered holidays and will not be compensated as such.~~ Such employees will also receive payment for the observed holiday at straight time in lieu of time off for the specified holiday. ~~Police Lieutenants scheduled to work on a holiday will be paid time and one-half for work performed on the observed holiday.~~ Employees reporting to work on a "call-in" basis on an observed holiday will receive time and one-half for all hours worked for a minimum of two hours and will also receive payment for the holiday at straight time.
