

RESOLUTION

TO CONTINUE WITH A SELF-FUNDED WORKERS' COMPENSATION PLAN

WHEREAS, the State and its political subdivisions may self-insure workers' compensation pursuant to the Wisconsin Workers' Compensation Act (Act) without a special order from the Department of Workforce Development (Department) if they agree to report faithfully all compensable injuries and agree to comply with the Act and rules of the Department; and

WHEREAS, the City of Manitowoc has been self-insured for Workers' Compensation since 2016 and it is in the best interest of the City's administration of the Workers' Compensation insurance to continue with a self-insured plan; and

WHEREAS, the City is obligated to pass a continuing resolution every three years restating the intention to remain self-insured;

WHEREAS, the City passed a continuing resolution restating the intention to remain self-insured on October 18, 2021 for the years 2022 - 2024.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Manitowoc to continue as a self-insured plan under Wisconsin Administrative Code DWD 80.60 for the years 2025 - 2027.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Finance Director and Human Resources Director are authorized to enter into any agreements necessary to remain self-insured, included those with stop-loss carriers and third-party plan administrators.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk forward a certified copy of this resolution to the Workers' Compensation Division, Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development.
