

Lincoln Park Camping Rules

Reservations:

Must be 21 years of age to make a reservation. Reservations may be made no earlier than one year in advance. Online reservations must be made at least seven days in advance.

Campsites 3 and 4 are ADA accessible sites.

Cost is \$15.00 per night.

Hours

Campground is open from May 1 through Labor Day, weather dependent. The park is closed to non-campers between 11 pm - 6 am. All visitors must leave the park by 11 pm.

Fire & Firewood

Fires are allowed in fire rings and grills only. Do not leave fires unattended, and put out all fires before leaving. Do not burn garbage, plastic, cans or other recyclable items.

Do not remove hot materials from the fire ring or grill and make sure the fire is out and grill or fire ring is cool before leaving the area.

DO NOT COLLECT FIREWOOD FROM THE PARK LAND. Bundled firewood is available at Piggly Wiggly, 1339 N. 8th Street

If you are bringing wood in to your site it must be from within 10 miles of the campsite per Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources rules.

Campfires are restricted to the fire rings supplied at each campsite. NO bonfires will be allowed.

Switching Camp sites

Campers may not switch sites without prior approval from the Parks Department Office.

Vehicles and Tents

Motor vehicles are restricted to the designated parking areas on each campsite. No more than one motor vehicle is allowed per campsite after 11:00 pm. Maximum occupancy is 1 tent & 6 people per campsite.

Vehicle must have vehicle permission displayed prominently in front window. The renter is responsible for obtaining all necessary paperwork.

Do not block interior roads. All vehicles must fit on your site.

The City of Manitowoc is not responsible for any damage to vehicles, theft of vehicle or property. Please lock and secure your belongings. Call the Parks Office at (920) 686-3580 for lost and found inquiries.

Check In/out time

Campsite check in is 3:00 pm. and check out time is by 1:00 pm. Maximum stay is limited to seven consecutive days.

If you or any member or guest of your camping party violates any state law or City Ordinance you may have your camping permit revoked and lose any fees that you have paid. You may also be charged for any damages.

Carry in and Carry out.

All garbage and litter must either be deposited in containers provided or take with you when you leave. The renter may be required to pay additional costs for damages or extra staff time required to clean and restore the area. This amount will be determined on a cost recovery basis.

Camping Conduct / Noise

No one may engage in violent, abusive, indecent, profane, boisterous unreasonable loud or otherwise disorderly conduct or conduct with intent to cause or provoke a disturbance or create a breach of peace. The City may expel anyone who violates these rules.

Please be courteous to your camping neighbors. At no time may the noise on the campsite create a disturbance of the peace. Quiet hours will be enforced from 11:00 pm – 6:00 am.

It is illegal to cut live vegetation for any reason.

Please use proper language that is appropriate for all ages. Everyone is here to relax and have a good time.

No generators are allowed for use at the campsites.

Do not feed animals in the park.

You are responsible for reporting any damages upon arrival or you may be held liable for them.

Alcohol Use

People of legal drinking age may bring alcoholic beverages along.

Grill Use

If using your own grill, dispose of coals in an available park grill or fire ring.

Cancellation/No Show

There will be a \$5.00 charge for cancellations. Failure to submit a cancellation of your reservation within 72 hours of scheduled check in time, categorizes you as a no-show. No Shows will not receive a refund of any fees.

If you do not check in and occupy your reserved site before 3:00 pm the day following the scheduled arrival date and remain for the duration of the reservation, you will forfeit the site, and not receive a refund of any fees.

We do not charge extra for sunshine and we will not give refunds if it rains.

PETS

No pets allowed, except for service animals.

WHO TO CALL

For emergencies, call 911.

For problems with the campsite or issues with cleanliness **outside of regular office hours**, call the Police Department Joint Dispatch Center at (920) 683-4470 **prior to your use of the facility**. They are able to contact the on-duty person for the Parks Department.
