I do not mean to be judgmental regarding the people who live in this area she is talking about, but many of the people are very transient in nature(temporary residents) as well as not being concerned about their surroundings and that of others on those East and westbound side streets of Hamilton, Madison, Columbus etc.

I have several past experiences of heading north and south on S. 16th, and being t-boned by another east/westbound driver heading fast and not stopping.

Drivers most often are going way too fast for the area with the amount of little children that are playing near the streets, and are not always aware of them due to all the other vehicles parked in the streets-kids, animals darting in and out. Even on Division Street and S. 16th which is a major 4 stop intersection, there are many motorists who use this as a drag way running the stop sign heading east/west on Division!

I would agree We do need some increased enforcement of this general area, and should include this on the May agenda for Public Safety. I will take care of contacting Cynthia.
