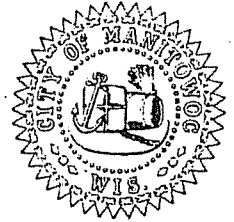

The tonnage of cement shipped to St. Mary's Cement Inc. decreased by 60,753 tons from last year.

Michel's Corporation decreased their outbound tonnage of stone by 67,428 tons over last year.

Manitowoc Public Utilities did not have any shipments of coal by way of water in 2013.

Riverland Agriculture stated they received zero shipments.

DeepFlex reported they didn't have any shipments, the material load was small enough to send out by truck.

Overall, the net tonnage has decreased by 128,306 tons from last year. This is the lowest reported number since the tracking of commercial movement in the Manitowoc harbor. The slumping economy has continued to be evident as reflected in the commercial activity conducted in 2013.

Attached is a report for the Eighth Street and Tenth Street Bridge lifts by month and type along with a yearly summary from 1977 through 2013.
