Good Afternoon,

The Markowskis recently filed a concern with Inspector Keil regarding the boats parked in yards around Sharon Lane. Given our recent involvement on this matter, I asked Scott to take no action until we could touch base. I copied our earlier correspondence for your convenience.

Should we present the issue of parking boats, boat trailers, etc., on front and side yards to Public Safety for discussion? To my knowledge, although we require RV's to be parked on hard surfaces, we've not enforced this on boats unless the boat is dilapidated or being unlawfully used, and the MMC is not as clear as it could be. I'd like to fix the MMC to be more clear on this point but only if we have Council's support on this restriction. We had a fair amount of pushback from citizens when we cleaned up the cars-in-yards ordinance last year.

However, if PD, CD, and Fire agree that this restriction should be enacted, I will draft one along with a memo for Public Safety consideration rather than bringing it there for discussion first.
