The Manitowoc County Civil War Round Table has completed the first phase of the Union Park Canon Project. We have decided to wait until 2019 complete the last part of the project. This would be the installation of a 25' foot flagpole on the grassy area just behind the canon.

As with the 25' foot flagpole that the Manitowoc County Civil War Round Table installed at the Grand Army of the Republic site at Evergreen Cemetery several years ago, the Roundtable will once again take complete responsibility for the upkeep and maintenance of the flagpole at Union Park. To include, that an American flag in good condition is always flying on the flagpole and that the flag will always be lit with solar powered lights similar to those installed at Evergreen Cemetery. THIS CANNON WAS USED IN THE BATTLE OF MANASSAS, VIRGINIA, ON JULY 21, 1861. IT WAS CAPTURED BY UNION FORCES AND IS NOW LOCATED IN THE MUSEUM OF THE CONFEDERATE MILITARY HISTORY IN MOBILE, ALABAMA. THIS CANNON IS ONE OF THE FEW LEFT IN EXISTENCE.
