The City of Gardena has a partnership with Enterprise Fleet Management to develop a system where the Police Department will replace the current fleet of non-patrol vehicles with new vehicles through a lease program. As such, the Police Department's capital rolling stock funding was decreased significantly, which prevented the Department from replacing the aging vehicles in our fleet.
