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PEDESTRIAN SIGN INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT

This Pedestrian Sign Installation an	d Maintenance Agreement	is entered into on this

Manitowoc, Wisconsin, a Wisconsin Mun	icipal Corporation (hereinaft	er "City") located at 900
Quay Street, Manitowoc, Wisconsin 542	20, and Holiday House of	Manitowoc County, Inc.
(hereinafter "Holiday House") a Wisco	nsin Corporation, located a	at 2818 Meadow Lane,
Manitowoc, Wisconsin 54220.		

WHEREAS, Holiday House desires the installation of Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) Pedestrian Crossing Signs located on Meadow Lane as identified in Exhibit "A" attached hereby and incorporated by reference.

WHEREAS, the purpose of the sign installation is to enhance safety by alerting drivers of the presence of pedestrians crossing mid-block, particularly Holiday House employees.

WHEREAS, the City has agreed to install two RRFB Pedestrian Crossing Signs upon the request of H.H. in the interest of safety to Holiday House employees and the general public upon the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

WHEREAS, Holiday House agrees to pay 50% of the full cost of the sign installation and also agrees to pay an annual maintenance fee.

WHEREAS, the property upon which the signs are to be located is shown on the attached map as Exhibit "A" which is hereby incorporated by reference and is more particularly described as follows:

A location in the right-of-way in the SE ¼ of Section 24, T 19 N., R 23 E., and more particularly described as being located in the City's right-of-way known as Meadow Lane between Riverview Drive and S. 29th Street.

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

ARTICLE I

SIGNS

<u>Section 1.</u> Property. This agreement shall pertain to two (2) solar powered Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFB's) with push button activation and fluorescent yellow pedestrian crossing signs similar to those shown in the attached, Exhibit 'B', which is hereby incorporated by reference.

Section 2. Sign Location. The exact location of the signs shall be determined by the Director of Public Infrastructure/City Engineer for the City in his or her sole discretion. One sign shall be placed on the north side of Meadow Lane at the crosswalk and the other on the south side of Meadow Lane at the crosswalk. The location of the signs shall be for the purpose of enhancing safety by alerting drivers of the presence of a mid-block pedestrian crossing.

<u>Section 3.</u> Public Right-of-Way. The sign(s) shall be placed in the public right-of-way, and shall be under the ownership and control of the City, and shall be held for the use of the general public, including any Holiday House employees.

Section 4. Cost of the Signs and Installation. Holiday House shall pay for 50% of the full cost of the RRFB sign installation on Meadow Lane. The costs shall include, but are not limited to, supplying, shipping and transportation charges for the RRFB signs, labor for placement of RRFB signs, materials used to secure placement, equipment utilized for installation and any other costs associated with the purchase and installation of the RRFB signs for this mid-block crosswalk. Payment for installation and materials shall be paid by Holiday House within thirty (30) days of receiving the billing statement from the City's Department of Public Infrastructure.

<u>Section 5.</u> Ownership. The sign or signs and all materials for installation shall be placed in the City's right-of-way and shall be solely owned by the City.

ARTICLE II

TERMS

<u>Section 1.</u> Agreement Term. This Agreement shall become effective immediately upon it's signing by all parties and shall remain in force for forty (40) years. After forty (40) years, this Agreement shall automatically renew on a yearly basis, on January 1st of each year, unless either party notifies the other within thirty (30) days of the 1st of January their desire to no longer maintain the signs.

<u>Section 2.</u> Payment for Maintenance. Holiday House shall be responsible to pay an annual fee for the maintenance of said signs, which maintenance shall be provided by the City's Department of Public Infrastructure (hereinafter "DPI"). Holiday House shall not perform any maintenance to the sign(s). If Holiday House feels there is a need for maintenance, Holiday House shall notify DPI requesting an inspection of the sign(s) to determine if there is in fact a need for maintenance.

Section 3. Annual Maintenance Fee. The annual maintenance fee shall be \$150.00 per year, for the first three (3) years of this Agreement, commencing January 1, 2019, due on or before January 1st of any given year. Beginning with and including 2022 the annual fee shall increase annually on January 1st of each succeeding year \$5.00 per year as long as this Agreement is in effect. There shall be no pro-ration of the annual fee for any reason.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Maintenance Defined</u> Maintenance shall include all costs for providing a secure sign structure, working push button activation, working RRFB lights, retro-reflective crosswalk sign face material and batteries. Any additional items not specifically noted as maintenance shall be considered repairs/replacement.

Section 5. Repairs and Replacement

- a. <u>Damage.</u> In the event of damage, destruction or deterioration of any kind, by any means, to the sign or signs, the City, through DPI in its sole discretion, shall determine if the sign(s) shall be repaired or replaced.
- b. <u>Cost of Repairs/Replacement.</u> If the City, through DPI, determines that the sign or signs should be repaired or replaced, it shall do so at Holiday House's cost. The City shall provide Holiday House with ten (10) days written notice in accordance with Article III of this agreement of any proposed repair or replacement of the signs along with an estimate of the cost of any such repairs or replacement. Any repair or replacement of the signs shall be billed to Holiday House on a time and material basis, payable by Holiday House within thirty (30) days of receipt of the bill from the City.

Section 6. Termination.

- a. <u>Termination For Convenience By Holiday House</u>. Notwithstanding the provisions Article II, Section 1 above, Holiday House may, at any time following ten (10) years after the execution of this Agreement, terminate this Agreement and any and all of its obligations hereunder at its sole convenience upon providing a thirty (30) day written notice of termination to the City in accordance with Article III of this Agreement. Upon notification, it shall be in the City's sole discretion to determine whether the signs shall remain in place or be removed, at no further cost to Holiday House.
- b. <u>Termination For Cause By The City.</u> The City may terminate this Agreement at any time upon thirty (30) days written notice to Holiday House in accordance with Article III of this Agreement, if the City in its sole discretion, determines the signs create a hazard or the signs are in violation of any Local, State or Federal Law.

c. <u>Default And Termination</u> If either party fails to perform or observe any material term or condition of this Agreement, then such party would be in default of the Agreement and the non-defaulting party may terminate the Agreement. The party seeking to terminate the Agreement must provide written notice of default to the defaulting party. This written notice must specify the default(s) giving rise to the right to terminate the Agreement. The defaulting party will have thirty (30) days to cure the default(s) unless such cure period is extended by agreement of the parties. If the default is not cured within this thirty (30) day period or any extension thereof, then the Agreement will automatically terminate.

ARTICLE III

NOTICE

All notice required or otherwise given hereunder shall be in writing and delivered personally or by registered mail. All mailed notice shall require proof of acknowledgement of receipt of said notice and addressed, as the case may be, to the respective party as addressed below:

Either party may change the address to which notice is to be given by notifying the other party, in writing, of such a change.

ARTICLE IV

APPLICABLE LAW

This agreement shall be deemed to have been made in Manitowoc County, Wisconsin and shall be governed by and construed under, and enforced in accordance with, the laws of the State of Wisconsin. All actions or proceedings relating directly or indirectly to this Agreement, whether sounding in contract or tort, shall be litigated only in the Circuit Court located in Manitowoc County, Wisconsin. All parties to this Agreement hereby subject themselves to the jurisdiction of the Circuit Court for Manitowoc County, Wisconsin.

ARTICLE V

HEADINGS

The section titles have been inserted in this Agreement primarily for convenience and do not define, limit or construe the contents of such paragraphs. If headings conflict, the text shall control.

ARTICLE VI

RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES

Nothing in this Agreement, nor any act of the City or Holiday House shall be deemed or be construed by the parties hereto or by any third party as creating the relationship of principal and agent or of partnership or of joint venture between the City and Holiday House.

ARTICLE VII

ASSIGNABILITY

Holiday House shall not assign this Agreement or any part of it without the prior written consent of the City, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

ARTICLE VIII

MODIFICATION

This is the entire Agreement made this date between the parties and any modification or change shall be in writing, by agreement of the parties and executed with the same formality as this document.

ARTICLE IX

DRAFTING OF AGREEMENT

All parties have contributed to the drafting of this Agreement. In the event of a controversy, dispute or contest over the meaning, interpretation, validity or enforcement of this Agreement or any of its terms or conditions, there shall be no inferences, presumption or conclusion drawn whatsoever against any party whatsoever by virtue of that party having drafted this Agreement or any portion thereof.

This Agreement shall be dated, effective and binding on the parties as of the date of the last execution.


