Ed Hansen was present to update the Committee on their intentions to improve Red Arrow Park. They are requesting final approval on design operation mouring sun.

They presented a design and map to show the position they are requesting so the sun will shine down on the memorial. They are also looking to add more trees.

- C. Scheinoha explained that there was discussion about eliminating both baseball diamonds but now just talk about the west diamond.
- D. Soeldner said this is a one of a kind project.

The Committee is in favor of supporting the purpose of the park and the direction they are looking to go. J. Brey thought they could have a decision after the budget gets approved. They are recommending elimination of the western baseball diamond to allow the establishment of the Red Arrow division monument on said location.

C. Scheinoha said he could talk to the school system about direction we'd like to go and we could dig some test holes to see what was underneath.

The Committee is in support of eliminating the western ball diamond and should bring back to the December meeting.

There are currently 30 undeveloped lots remaining and have been for sale since 2002.

Terry Fox recommended filing a plan on how to maintain the vacant lots. C. Scheinoha explained that our current Ordinance reads if within 200 feet of a developed lot, it needs to be cut. There was a portion of the lot that fell within 200 feet.

G. Minikel said Woodridge and Silver Ridge are the only two (2) subdivisions that have quite a few vacant lots.

The Committee's recommendation was to draft an Ordinance policy and bring back to the Committee.
