Hi Amber,

I looked at the numbers of pedestrians at the intersection for the past 3 traffic counts.

Here are the numbers we have:

June 12, 2008: 59 peds. This was a summer count and was after school was out for summer, so this one is likely missing school kids crossing the street.

January 28, 2009: 43 peds. This was a winter count so we would expect lower numbers.

June 8, 2017: 144 peds. This was the last day of school for MPSD with a noon dismissal.

I believe that the Committee and Council approved Dan's Pedestrian Crossing Treatment Installation Guidelines.

It would take quite a bit of time to go through the guidelines, but I do not believe that there will be enough pedestrians hourly to warrant the RRFB signals. However, since there are school aged children crossing there, it may meet that warrant, but it is hard to tell because we do not keep track of the age of the pedestrians crossing the intersection.

We will be reconstructing Dewey St. from S. 10th to S. 26th St. in 2018. If we (Committee/Council) feels that the RRFB's would be warranted for this intersection, then we could add these pedestrian crossing signals to the bid.

I would certainly recommend having this issue on the next Public Safety Committee Agenda (Feb. 12th), so that they can take final action on this issue once and for all.
