I do not believe that the DOT has reneged on the trees. We have known since about 2012/2013 that all the trees were coming down and that the DOT would not re-plant trees in the terrace as it will be too narrow per their standards. I recall stating at the first advisory committee meeting that the trees will be decimated and that the property owners and citizens are not going to be happy about it.

I was told by the DOT and the Consultant that there would be a landscaping plan as part of the contract, which there is. I believe that this is what was told to the past PI Committees.

I believe that our Forester, Al Rehme, assisted Ayres Assoc. with the design for the landscaping plans.

I have attached the tree planting information from the current plans.

FYI: There are several trees being replaced behind the sidewalk by Wilson Jr. High School. This was a requirement mandated by the Historical Policies as Wilson is a historically significant building.

The only way that some of the trees could have been saved would have been to go with the proposal of only 2 driving lanes (one lane in each direction) and a two-way left turn lane in the middle. This would have eliminated the island/boulevard. There would have been 6 ft, wide bicycle lanes and large terraces with trees.

The Committee and Council at that time was very adamant about rebuilding the street with 4 lanes as it is now and keeping the median, so much so that there was a resolution in 2013 indicating the City wants the DOT to rebuild the roadway with 4 lanes as it is now.

Even if we went with this 2 lane option, there would have likely been many trees removed due to the underground utility replacements.
