## 39 roclamation

- **WHEREAS**, the city of Manitowoc is committed to ensuring the safety and security of all those living in and visiting Manitowoc; and
- **WHEREAS**, fire is a serious public safety concern both locally and nationally, and homes are the locations where people are at greatest risk from fire; and
- **WHEREAS**, home fires killed 3,655 people in the United States in 2018, according to the National Fire Protection Association® (NFPA®), and fire departments in the United States responded to an estimated average of 354,400 home structure fires per year; and
- WHEREAS, cooking is the leading cause of home fires in the United States where fire departments responded to more than 172,900 annually between 2014 and 2018; and
- WHEREAS, two of every five home fires start in the kitchen with 31% of these fires resulting from unattended cooking; and
- WHEREAS, more than half of reported non-fatal home cooking fire injuries occurred when the victims tried to fight the fire themselves; and
- WHEREAS, children under five face a higher risk of non-fire burns associated with cooking than being burned in a cooking fire; and
- WHEREAS, Manitowoc residents should stay in the kitchen when frying food on the stovetop, keep a three-foot kid-free zone around cooking areas and keep anything that can catch fire away from stove tops; and
- WHEREAS, residents who have planned and practiced a home fire escape plan are more prepared and will therefore be more likely to survive a fire; and
- WHEREAS, working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in reported home fires in half; and
- WHEREAS, Manitowoc Fire Rescue Department is dedicated to reducing the occurrence of home fires and home fire injuries through prevention and protection education; and
- WHEREAS, Manitowoc residents are responsive to public education measures and are able to take personal steps to increase their safety from fire, especially in their homes; and
- WHEREAS, the 2020 Fire Prevention Week theme<sup>TM</sup>, "Serve Up Fire Safety in the Kitchen!" effectively serves to remind us to stay alert and use caution when cooking to reduce the risk of kitchen fires.
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, JUSTIN M. NICKELS, Mayor of the City of Manitowoc, do hereby proclaim October 4<sup>th</sup> 10<sup>th</sup>, 2020, as
