### Greg/Lynn,

I checked all the inlets, bee hives and open grates within the area of her house. All pipes and open grates are clear, no blockage. Th open grate type 1 inlet behind her house has a 6" PVC pipe running out of it to the inlet on Andrea, the pipe is not big enough to handle this much rain water. In 2009 the previous owner had flooding in her basement also, see email and pictures. So in 2009 we bored/jacked a storm sewer across N Rapids Road to help with the surface water problem and the City added a bee hive in front of 1925 N. Rapids Road.

I called her and left a voice mail and Connie called back an ½ hour later. I explained about the previous problem in 2009 with her. I mentioned to keep the drain clear from debris before any heavy rains. She was okay with the explanation. She is waiting for service master to clean up her finished basement.

This issue has been referred to Jim Muenzenmeyer and the Bldg. Insp. Dept. We feel that this is a private drainage issue like many others that have been brought to our attention this year during the bad rains on June 12<sup>th</sup> and July 19<sup>th</sup> and many other complaints in past years.

I believe that the 3 inches of rain that we received on July 19<sup>th</sup> (north side of City only) in a 60 minute period is approx. a 100 yr. Storm.

The storm sewers are not designed for 100 yr. Storms. The typical storm sewer design is a 10 yr. Storm. So, anytime we get these bigger gulley washers, we are going to have flooding issues.

On Tuesday, September 23, 2008 I met with the neighbors affected by the spring flooding at and near 4545 Andrea Court and offer the following recommendations:

### City

• Jet and camera the six inch storm sewer from the catch basin in the rear yard of 4545 Andrea Court to the 12" storm sewer in the street to ensure maximum flow rates can be achieved.

#### Mrs. Hein

- Re-landscape the side of your property to create an overland emergency spillway that will effectively channel any excess water from the catch basin in your rear yard to the street. For all but the largest storm events the existing catch basin will drain properly. For the extreme rain events where the catch basin is overburdened, the newly graded over-land spill way will better direct storm water into the cul-de-sac.
- If the above two remedies prove to be insufficient, properly installed window wells may need to be added to your home.

The most encouraging finding was the fact that the storm sewers in Andrea Court did not back up. Therefore, we need to channel any possible overflow to the street without impacting the home.

The City received estimates from Vinton Construction and Kip Gulseth.

# 4547 Andrea Court Drainage Issue

- V. Mellon explained that this was re-examined from a couple meetings ago. G. Minikel explained the drainage of N. Rapids Road. Basically an area south of the Covered Wagon is draining to the east. a vacant lot that G. Minikel believes is low and is taking ditch water and causing flooding on Andrea Court backyards. There are 3 culverts that lead to this vacant lot on Rapids Road, with the ditch not being very defined.
- G. Minikel explained that he walked this area and gave the Committee recommendations of what might help. Roof drains adjacent to the flooding area should be connected below ground; window wells would be beneficial as well.
- D. Soeldner explained that the big picture is that the water along Rapids still doesn't have a place to go. G. Minikel said that we should hold discussion with Gary Kennedy regarding whether this would be a County or City project.

The Committee recommended that Engineering shoot grades this winter for the Rapids Road area and contact Gary Kennedy. Engineering to bring back recommendation to the Committee and inform property owner (Becky Hein) as well.

# Driveway Access to Remiker Lane

Dean Schultz was present to request driveway access to Remiker Lane. He was previously told (in 2000) that this was private property and would not be able to access. This cul-de-sac was recently blacktopped and they are again requesting approval of access, since this street area became public right-of-way in 2005.

- Mr. Schultz owns Premier Lawn care and currently has a long driveway that accesses to Sunset, which he has to maintain. He said that there are approximately 8 semis that will use this access per year along with a couple of trucks in the morning and a couple in the afternoon.
- V. Mellon explained that this residence isn't in the city limits; however, it is public right-of-way.
- G. Minikel said that we had some issues in the past involving speeding along Remiker. Mr. Dean Schultz said that those issues have been addressed and the employee is no longer working for him.

Mike,

Per the Streets Committee last night, we need to cross section a portion of the ditch on the east side of N. Rapids Road from 1925 N. Rapids (Check's new office building) to the south to 1807 N. Rapids Road (Timber Lodge Liquor). We also need to investigate were the ditch between 1807 and 1815 N. Rapids Rd. discharges. I believe that it may go to Beaupre Court.

Dave Soeldner and the Committee would like us to see if we can either re-cut the ditch or build up a berm to prevent the stormwater from the 3 culverts at 1925, 2001, 2013 N. Rapids Rd. from discharging to the east across the vacant property at 1919 N. Rapids Road. This is their preferred solution to the drainage problem that Rebecca Hein has at 4545 Andrea Court. The other option is to relay the 6 inch storm sewer with 12 inch pipe. They want to do the cheapest solution and they feel that the re-ditching or berm would be cheaper than the \$12,000 estimate to relay the storm sewer to the back yard.

They requested that we determine this as soon as possible and whether or not we can construct the solution before next spring, which I am not sure is possible.

Val and I have to contact Gary Kennedy about the ditching as well. If a berm is needed can we keep it within the R/W. We probably need to discuss the problem with the owner at 1919 N. Rapids Road.

The Manitowoc Area received approx. 4.0 inches of rain on June 15, 2010. The biggest portion of the rainfall was between approx. 4 pm and 6:30 pm (approximately 2 to 2.5 inches). Prior to 4 pm, I heard that we had received about 1.6 or 1.8 inches of rain.
