Phase 2 would be adding green space putting in picnic area with trees.

Currently working on obtaining quotes with MPU to update power to 200 amp, as event organizers are running out of power and are turning away food trucks and are limiting to the bands that we can have in this area. April said we are bringing in people to the downtown area and the energy that comes along with it.

April said we are at early stages of discussion. J. Brey is in full support and would like to see continue.

E. Sitkiewitz said there are alot of numbers and options and he isn't the expert to determine how much power is actually required at this location.

M. Howe said that the strategic placing of lines and power is going to be a challenge. He would like to bring into one project.

April said we don't want to mess up the site as the Farmer's Market will need to be there too.

C. Scheinoha said one vendor can use up to 50 amps of power. Subfest didn't have enough power and were popping breakers and our staff was working to keep power going. Balloon Glow is another event that could use more power as well.

Who is responsible? Would they put in or would it be part of the rental charges.

The Committee didn't want to bore in the parking lot.

The Committee recommended bringing back to the April Meeting.
