they replace some of the lights in the downtown area, they will include one be installed in this park area as well.

Paul Kluenker, was present to discuss his concern with the intersection of N. 11th and Waldo Blvd and wanted the Menasha and Waldo Blvd intersection to be opened. The increased southbound traffic on N. 11th Street made it dangerous according to Mr. Kluenker.

The Committee and Staff discussed.

The recommendation was to perform traffic counts this summer and obtain accident data to support conversations with the State.

L. Kummer wasn't in favor of creating a right turn on southwest corner of Waldo and N. 11th Street as Mr. Kluenker recommended.

A motion was made by Jim Brey, seconded by Scott McMeans, that the Request for a right turn lane at Southwest Corner of N. 11th and Waldo was placed on file for Consent Agenda. The Committee recommended performing traffic counts in July 2020 and providing accident date for 6 months the State of Wisconsin if there is any potential changes to be addressed. Rollie Kania, 1401 South 26th Street, was present to discuss the condition of the street. It is a truck route, but it is getting worse and the cracks are getting wider, according to Mr. Kania. It is causing rattling to occur inside the house.

J. Brey asked where the repairs would begin and end. He said that he will support in 2021 budget. He asked if there was something that could be done

with the cracks in the mean time.

C. Scheinoha said that they did some mastic repairs on Waldo Blvd and it held together. He said we could rent the machine to do the work and it could last a couple years. D. Koski said he agrees that this will be a good repair to do in the spring.

A motion was made by Jim Brey, seconded by Scott McMeans, to recommend reconstruction of S. 26th Street for an area from Division Street to Hamilton Street, to be determined in 2021 budget. The Request was approved for consent agenda. The motion carried by the following vote:

If this will be sufficient for the Wisconsin DOT Council will make final approval of Resolution.

A motion was made by Chairperson Jeremiah Novak, seconded by Scott McMeans, that the Resolution for LRIP funding for Reed Avenue be approved as passed by Public Infrastructure Committee to meet the deadline, and then referred to council, if approved by the WIDOT. L. Majerus was present and recommended allowing City Attorney to draft resolution to approve the increases for Council.

L. Kummer said there isn't anything for the fee to recoup the cost of the 800 amp service we put in the lot. He would like to see us recoup some of the costs and amended the list to charge \$1,000 per day for the 800 amp service usage. J. Brey seconded the motion.

The Committee discussed the amp fee.

J. Novak asked if we have surrounding communities and what they charge. N. Mueller said we could compare utility bills or check with surrounding communities.

L. Kummer said we are looking to recoup the cost of the capital investment as well.

L. Majerus said this could go as a bundled package into the Special Events charges that the staff is currently putting together. L. Kummer would like to see something in place for this summer.

A motion was made by Jim Brey, seconded by Scott McMeans, that the Resolution was approved and referred to council.

A motion was made by Vice Chair Lee H. Kummer, seconded by Jim Brey, to amend the Resolution to include the 800 amp service to be included in the Resolution at a daily fee of \$1,000.

After further discussion, J. Brey called the question on this amendment.
