


Indulge in the “Sparkle” of the Enchanted Evergleams at Manitowoc Public Library

‘Tis the season, as they say, and this year marks the tenth such season for Evergleam aluminum Christmas trees being featured in windows throughout Downtown Manitowoc.

Since the event was first devised in 2015, “Evergleams on Eighth” has evolved and grown—more businesses participate than ever before and a whole group of collectors now has the chance to showcase their trees, with nearly 200 on display this year. Much of this success can be directly attributed to a partnership formed with Manitowoc Public Library, which affords opportunities for large-scale displays and greater public engagement.

Over the years, programming on pertinent topics was added to compliment the displays—first [Sparkle!: The History of Aluminum Trees](#), then a virtual version during the 2020 COVID pandemic. Sometime after I joined up with the “Gleam Team,” a restoration clinic called “Paging Dr. Evergleam” came into being. And the [Virtual Sparkle Event](#) turned into a sort of interview show where the hosts—Barb Bundy-Jost and myself—interviewed individuals with first-person accounts of factory life at Aluminum Specialty Company during the years of tree production (1959-1972) . . . sort of an original cast reunion.

If you know me, you know I always try to keep things fresh. Every season, I play a primary role in planning-out what all of the window displays at each of the businesses will look like. And every year, I try to make them look a little bit different. The same can be said for the library displays, and maybe now the programming, too.

Since we’ve done the same sort of format for our virtual “Sparkle” interview show for several years now, we thought we would shake things up a little for our Ten-Year Anniversary. The displays in Downtown Manitowoc highlight trees mostly supplied by six collectors. We do, however, have many friends who also have trees and collections of their own that, due primarily to proximity reasons, don’t get to participate in our event.



Sometimes, even the best-laid plans don't quite turn out exactly as one expects.

For instance, when I was some thirty-five-or-so years younger, my plan had a singular focus—to become a working actor. Not a hobbyist, but someone who could state that acting was their job. Quite honestly, I gave it my best shot. My wife and I moved out to the New York City area, I dutifully auditioned, did touring theater to get my foot in the door, did showcases Off- and Off-Off-Broadway in the hopes of it leading somewhere more sustainable. All the standard things. And while I got tantalizingly close a couple of times, things didn't quite pan out the way that I hoped that they would.

I'm not complaining though. I met some phenomenal people along the way, including one of two truly epic people with whom I'm fortunate to have encountered. Jack—my boss at a poster auction house where I was employed to make ends meet when I was between acting gig—was one such individual. A holocaust survivor who as an adult in America would go bankrupt several times (the first time after putting everything he had into a “Spaghetti-on-a-Stick” gambit to sell on the boardwalk at Coney Island that failed spectacularly) before becoming one of the world's foremost authorities in vintage and antique advertising lithographs.

I certainly would never have met Jack or performed with Rockettes had I took my best shot in NYC. Not exactly how I had planned things, but those twists and turns certainly provided me with ammunition for some amazing stories. And while this story would go on far too long to tell at the upcoming [Tales from the Taproom 5: A StorySlam for Adults \(21+\)](#) at PetSkull Brewing Company, it definitely illustrates a point: for every unexpected turn in a plan, a fantastic story is sure to follow.

When you come right down to it, I'd be willing to bet American dollars that practically everyone has some sort of story to tell about when things didn't turn out as planned—for better or worse. And that's precisely what we're looking for at [Tales from the Taproom 5: A StorySlam for Adults \(21+\) at PetSkull Brewing Company](#). Sponsored by Seehafer News, this is the last Manitowoc Public Library/PetSkull Brewing story slam of 2025 and will be taking place from 6-8 PM on Thursday, December 11.

The theme for this evening is “Whoopsies!” and we’re looking for people to tell their true stories, tales that illustrate that even the best laid plans don’t always exactly go according to, well, the plan. The only required element of whatever story you tell is that it has to be about a time where something didn’t quite work out the way you thought it would!

Just five minutes and a true, personal favorite misadventure. And once again, this installment of [“Tales from the Taproom”](#) is going to be cohosted by the nonlinear Steph Peters, Director of Community Engagement at the YMCA.

You don’t have to come to “The Taproom” to tell a story—you can come to listen, enjoy, and, bask in the wonder of communal storytelling. However, should you want to step up to the mic to share a story in-line with the evening’s theme, sign-up begins at 5:30 PM. We’ll fit in as many stories as possible during the allotted time. There will be a timekeeper who will cut people off at five minutes, so knowing your story well is a necessity.

We can’t wait to hear all about your whoopsie at the December installment of [“Tales from the Taproom!”](#)




All of these programs will take place in the Balkansky Community Room. Children ages eight and under must be accompanied by a guardian at all times.

Dino-Mite Week Roars into Manitowoc Public Library!

Dinosaurs are set to take center stage at Manitowoc Public Library this winter as Dino-Mite Week stomps into town from **January 12 through 19**. The week-long celebration will transform the Library into a Jurassic adventure, offering families a mix of hands-on activities, creative crafts, and educational fun. The

festivities will culminate in a spectacular finale performance on **Monday, January 19, at 2 PM**, when lifelike animatronic dinosaurs take the spotlight in *Dinosaur Dimensions Live*.

Throughout the week, visitors can enjoy a variety of interactive experiences designed to spark curiosity and imagination. Life-size Tyrannosaurus Rex footprints will march across the library's rotunda windows, setting the stage for adventure as families explore. One favorite activity is the Cretaceous Count, where participants estimate the size of a large herd of mini dinos. The closest guess will roar away with a rex-cellent prize—the book *Flip-o-saurus: Make Your Own Wacky Dinosaur*, by Sara Ball, a playful mix-and-match book that lets kids create their own silly prehistoric creatures.

Other activities include the **Fossil Find Scavenger Hunt**, where children match fossilized skeletons to their prehistoric fleshy counterparts. Every child who completes the hunt will earn a prize, ensuring that all participants walk away with a little Jurassic treasure. Triassic Trivia will test budding paleontologists on their knowledge, while the **Roll-A-Dino Game** invites kids to roll giant dice and invent their own unique dinosaur species. Final creations will be put on display, giving young artists the chance to see their imaginative creatures celebrated as part of Dino-Mite Week, while also earning them a completion prize.

Creativity will shine through with the **Magic Egg Activity**, where children design their own prehistoric egg and discover the surprise of a baby dino waiting to hatch from their masterpiece. Coloring sheets will encourage bold and imaginative designs, letting kids bring dinosaurs to life in their own unique style. Families can pick up Grab & Go Activity Bags filled with four ready-to-make craft projects to continue the fun at home, as well as posing for photos in a Jurassic-themed setting with playful dinosaur masks.

The celebration culminates on **Monday, January 19, at 2 PM**, when *Dinosaur Dimensions Live* triceratops-takes over the Library for a dynamic finale performance. Produced by **Strutz Entertainment**, the show features animatronic puppets that walk, blink, and roar, bringing prehistoric creatures to life in a way that is both thrilling and educational. Following the performance, families are invited to meet one of the dinosaurs up-close, take photos, and enjoy a rare chance to interact with a “living” dinosaur.

The timing of the finale is especially convenient. With schools closed for **Martin Luther King Jr. Day**, families have the perfect opportunity to attend together without weekday scheduling conflicts. The program is

inclusive and welcoming, ensuring children of all ages can participate, no matter if they dream of becoming paleontologists or simply love to roar like dinosaurs.
