I am dropping off some info concerning LUNA.

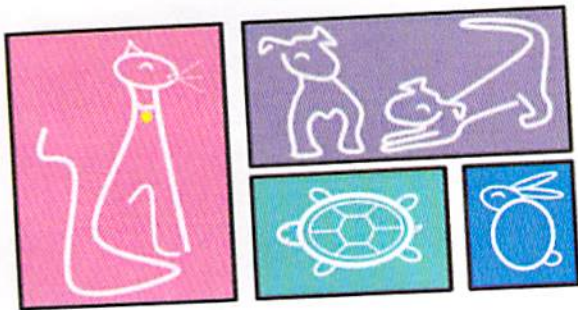

This letter is regarding Luna, a 3 year old dog currently owned by Rosemary Vallejo. I have examined Luna many times and have been her regular vet for most of her life. Luna is not aggressive and we have never had any issues treating her or dealing with her.

Luna was in a rough household as a puppy and had been accidentally bred before Rosemary took her in. We have always found her to be a happy dog who is a little protective of her people and her area.

According to her veterinary medical records, her first incident was a bike rider who cut through the backyard through private property where Luna was tethered with her puppies. She was defensive and chased the bike off the property, breaking her collar. She bit at the bike tire but managed to get the biker's lower leg.

Rosemary took this VERY seriously and got Luna a much stronger style of collar and began tethering her in the front yard instead of the backyard as she was concerned about kids coming into the backyard and worrying Luna.

Luna is not normally outside unattended, but on November 19th, the owner went inside to grab something and came out to Luna untethered and laying on the porch. She immediately hooked her back up to her tether and found that a link had come off of the metal collar securing her. She replaced the link and stayed outside with Luna. Later an officer stopped by and told her that Luna had bit someone. Rosemary was concerned about the woman and was told that she did not require medical treatment, but would go in if the wound started to swell.

We saw Luna right away for her required exams and we discussed how to keep Luna and everyone safe. I felt that having her in the front yard and tethered likely makes Luna feel more vulnerable. Rosemary then acquired a barrier to place between Luna and the sidewalk so she would not feel as exposed and defensive to people who walk by.

Luna is not an aggressive dog, just defensive of her space and her owner has taken steps to make sure that it is not an issue in the future.

Both bites were very superficial- a dog trying to get a person to leave, not trying to actually harm them. The biker was also trespassing on the owner's (and dog's) area, so this was not an unprovoked bite, and according to 14.020(3)e(2) would be considered exempt.

Luna is a wonderful dog, and I would in no way consider her to be dangerous.
