I'm hoping that I can come address the committee again. Since this meeting I've almost been hit three additional times trying to pull out onto Waldo - this last time being a near fatal t bone (blue chevy Silverado). In addition I have nearly been run off the road by three different dodge rams.

Rapids road and Waldo road are essentially highways in manitowoc with people driving at near highway speeds. This turns this part of manitowoc into a Wild West situation - one that police have not addressed at all. I have called the sheriffs department and the police department numerous times - being told that they will add additional patrols. Is there something I'm missing about this community? What should be a peaceful river valley is essentially a drag strip for muscle cars - heavily modified exhausts that are excruciatingly loud and of course Harley Davidsons. Why is everyone driving at the speed of meth around here?

I've spent ~ 40k in this community in the last year alone- that money will be gone from this community when I sell my house next year because of the traffic behavior here. If this community desires growth it is time to address the behavior of the drivers here or no one will want to move here. The future is walkable neighborhoods without cars - and manitowoc could do that with its downtown.

Over here on the north side it feels like I am living in a nascar race - and the police have absolutely no desire to help I would be extremely appreciative of the opportunity to address the council and the chief of police before I start the plans to sell this house due to the hostile environment on the roads here.

All the police would have to do is literally park a car by timeout or something - I have never seen a police cruiser doing speed enforcement here in this corner of manitowoc once. I am from Madison Wisconsin - a city about 10-12 times this size. No one drives there like they do here.

Why even have the church bells and things over here if it is just a dragstrip? Normal behavior is not causing this situation. It is abnormal - possibly impaired behavior.
