## Hi Curt,

I hope Ang and the kiddos are doing well! I was in a meeting last week and we had an idea that could be mutually beneficial for the City of Manitowoc and our company HMI. On a monthly basis our company hosts a training seminar. Companies from around the US and internationally travel to Manitowoc to attend this 2-3 day training event. These groups are evaluating the concrete raising business to see if this is something they want to start as a business in their area. Typically when we host this event we will schedule 'job shadowing' on residential projects with customers who have hired Raise Rite Concrete Lifting to lift their settled concrete. This is challenging when we have 20+people trying to watch a slab being raised in a small backyard. It has also been difficult from a customer service standpoint. You can understand how intimidating it can be to have a big group of people pile on to your property to watch a concrete slab get raised back into place.

Here is where the city comes in. We are wondering if the city, parks, or any other public owned property might have concrete that needs to be raised? We would like to use this as an opportunity to feature the project and teach the attendees on a live demo. We would not charge the city for the repair. Once a month April-November we would spend about 4 hours on the project. If the project is large enough, we could complete it in phases across multiple seminars. This could be a great way for the city to save some money and we could have bigger groups of attendees on public property. This could be a park pavilion slab that is settled or walkways with a trip hazard. We can also correct a slab pitch to improve drainage or level out a cracked slab. We would also have the capacity to raise a roadway section provided we would have time to finish the project within the 4 hour time window. This can re-pitch a slab or remove a low point.

If you have a few ideas for areas to repair, we can send an estimator out to evaluate the area. The next seminar is planned for April with a shadowing day planned on April 10th (weather permitting). Please let me know if you think this is something the city would be interested in.
