Nick,

I will come up with a better map. I believe that the speed limit and ordinance changes at River Ct.

I understand the request to some extent, slow down traffic prior to and after the roundabout.

However, my thoughts or concerns are as follows:

I do not have any issue with making it 25 mph for westbound traffic. It does not make a lot of sense to speed up to 35 out of the Roundabout and then drop down to 25 in 2-3 blocks.

However, in the eastbound direction, I do have concerns about the proposed change. Once drivers get past the residential homes (east of N. 5th St.) they are going to speed up no matter what the speed limit signs say.

I think you will just have more people violating the speed limit. Other than deer, I do not see a great reason to make it 25 mph. That being said, I am not sure that we want two different speeds in the same area.

My 2 cents. It is really up to the Committee to decide.





ORDINANCE

An Ordinance to amend Section 10.010 of the Manitowoc Municipal Code regulating Provisions of State Law Adopted by Reference.

The Mayor and Common Council of the City of Manitowoc do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 10.010 is amended to read as follows:

"10.010 Provisions of State Law Adopted by Reference.

(3) Speed Limits.

..."

(b) Outlying Districts and Modification of Speed Restrictions. ...

Waldo Boulevard.

- A. The speed limit on Waldo Boulevard from Memorial Drive to River Court shall be 35 25 miles per hour.
- B. The speed limit on Waldo Boulevard from North 20th Street to North 23rd Street shall be 30 miles per hour.
- C. The speed limit on Waldo Boulevard from North 23rd Street to Rapids Road shall be 35 miles per hour.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect the day after publication.
